Dear Parents,

Your child is learning English at school with *Incredible English*. They learn English through stories, songs, games and puzzles. These activities put vocabulary and grammar into meaningful contexts and make the learning experience fun and memorable.

Learning a language takes time and patience. Revision and reinforcement are key in learning a language effectively. The Weekend Homework Pack provides your child with lots of opportunities to review and consolidate what he or she has been learning in class. There are two worksheets which focus on the vocabulary and grammar, one which develops the children's cognitive skills through English and one which practises the kind of activity they will meet in internationally recognised exams.

Your role in your children's learning is very important. Your support and interest shows that learning English is a priority for you, and so it becomes important to your child as well. You can help your child in the following ways:

- Provide a time and physical space where they can sit down and concentrate on their work. Be on hand if you can.
- Encourage and praise your child's work, and always focus on the positive.
- Support your child if necessary, give them clues, or point out where they are going wrong. But don't give them the answer as true learning requires the child to do the work for themselves.
- See mistakes as a step on the way to learning. A mistake just means that the child needs a little more practice before getting it right.
- Make English a part of your everyday lives. See if your child can remember the new words and phrases when you are at home or out together. Have fun with English!
